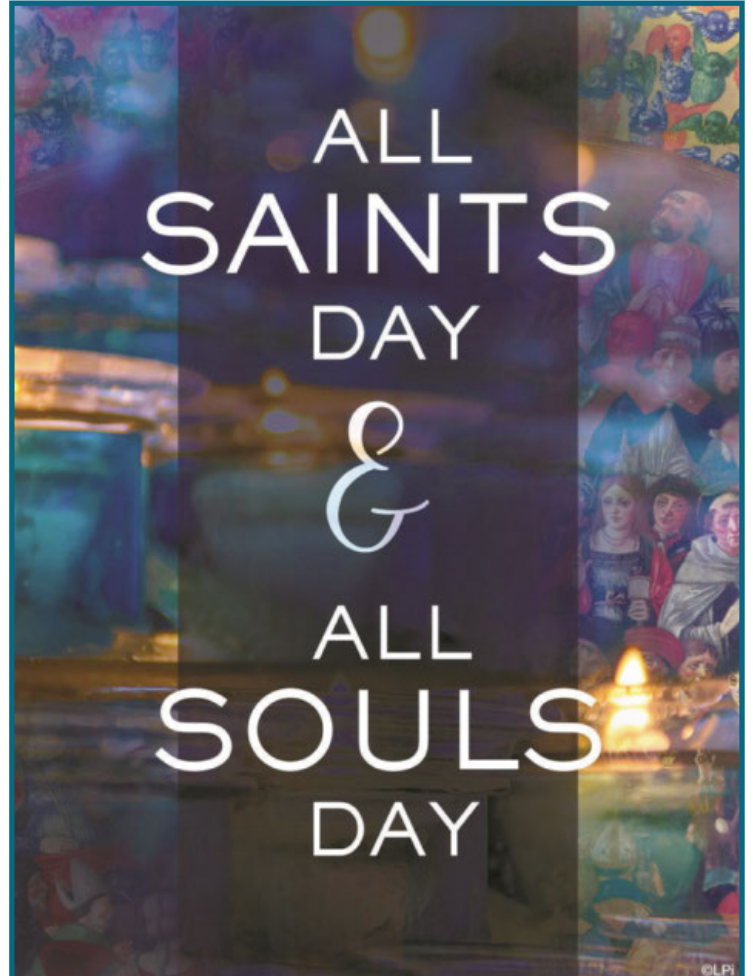

Celebrating the Feast of All Saints' and All Souls'

There is little known evidence that allows us to trace the origins of the celebration of All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day; however, when Christianity was finally legalized in 313 A.D. during the reign of Constantine, it was then that the commemoration of the saints, and particularly the martyrs, became a common practice.

Along with the feast of All Saints' the celebration of All Souls' Day was established. The church has always encouraged the offering of prayers and Mass for the faithful departed in Purgatory, and has seen it as an opportunity to employ the prayers of the faithful on Earth to help usher these souls to their eternal reward – the Beatific Vision, the glorious vision of God.

Throughout the ages, other customs have developed surrounding the feast of All Souls', including in countries like Mexico where the relatives of the departed make garland wreaths and place paper flowers on the grave of the deceased on the morning of All Souls'. Families typically spend the entire day at the cemetery, where Mass is offered and special prayers and blessings are said over the graves of loved ones. This day is known as "Día de los Muertos", or Day of the Dead, and has been upheld as part of Mexico's sacred tradition.

We encourage anyone who can to attend Mass on this solemn day to honor and pray for all the departed especially their loved ones.

Celebrando la Fiesta de Todos los Santos y de Todos los Difuntos

Son pocos los datos conocidos que permitan rastrear los orígenes de la celebración del Día de Todos los Santos y del Día de Todos los Difuntos; sin embargo, cuando el cristianismo fue finalmente legalizado en el año 313 d.C. durante el reinado de Constantino, fue entonces cuando la conmemoración de los santos, y particularmente de los mártires, se convirtió en una práctica común.

Junto a la festividad de Todos los Santos se instauró la celebración del Día de Todos los Difuntos. La iglesia siempre ha alentado el ofrecimiento de oraciones y Misa por los fieles difuntos en el Purgatorio, y lo ha visto como una oportunidad de emplear las oraciones de los fieles en la Tierra para ayudar a llevar a estas almas a su recompensa eterna:

la Visión Beatífica, la gloriosa visión de Dios.

A lo largo de los tiempos, se han desarrollado otras costumbres en torno a la fiesta de Todos los Difuntos, incluso en países como México, donde los familiares de los difuntos hacen coronas de guirnaldas y colocan flores de papel en la tumba del difunto en la mañana de Todos los Difuntos. Las familias suelen pasar todo el día en el cementerio, donde se ofrece misa y se dicen oraciones y bendiciones especiales sobre las tumbas de sus seres queridos. Este día se conoce como "Día de los Muertos" y se ha mantenido como parte de la tradición sagrada de México.

Alentamos a cualquiera que pueda asistir a Misa en este día solemne a honrar y orar por sus difuntos, especialmente por sus seres queridos.

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Greatest Commandment:

**“You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, [with all your strength,] and with all your mind. You shall love your neighbor as yourself.”
Mt 22:37-39; Lk 10:27; Mk 12:30-31**

Again, we are presented with the main truth of our existence that we learned as the first principles of our faith: The Purpose of Man’s Existence. That principal is to *know, love* and *serve* God. *Catechism of the Catholic Church* Prologue I:1

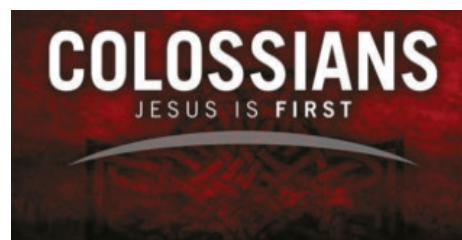
This is God’s love in truth for the world: That His love, wisdom and creation be manifest in Man through his Son, Jesus Christ. This is the image of God that both the Old and New Testaments teach us. There is no other greater truth than this for the universe. It is this simple and it is this difficult in the same breath. Because it also means we must love all persons as Jesus loves us, and treat His creation and gifts as things that we don’t own, but rather share.

Are we Christians truly followers of Jesus Christ? We follow weather patterns, we follow events, we follow people on electronic gadgets, but do we follow Our Lord with the same fervor? Have we replaced God in our lives with images, things, wants and ideas? Is our society using euphemisms of justice, security, empowerment and choice to replace God in the psyche of the human person?

Saint Paul alludes to this very understanding when he instructs the Colossians (**Col 1:15-20**) that our image of the world should be through Jesus Christ, the Son, because through the Son we are brought into the “fullness” of all creation that is God the Father and receive through Him the Ever-living Spirit. The Father and Son are one and have existed before all creation, but for our sake the Father sent the Son so that we may know Him beyond any doubt that we are of His image created.

It is also implied that through the Son, Jesus Christ, we are redeemed of our sins, and our souls taken up with His to where He has prepared for us a place with the Father. Jn 14:2-4

So, the Greatest Commandment is the universal truth, the AMEN, and a love for the one who gives us everlasting life that is manifested by the sacrificial love we show each other, as did Jesus Christ when He gave us His Body and Blood on the cross and in the Eucharist.
